

She went from helping her grandma at the salon as a kid, to doing hair in her mother's basement as a teen, to finally pursuing her cosmetology license. When Kenni became a single mother, she made the decision to move to Frederick to give her son a better chance at life. As her client base continued to grow, she quickly outgrew the suite that she was renting. Thanks to the Prosperity Center Savings Account program, she was able to upgrade from a 100sq ft. suite to a 1500sq ft. full service salon.



Carlin's Story

Carlin had a good job but dreamed of being a teacher. However, she wasn't sure she could afford it. But the Prosperity Center allowed Carlin to do just that. "The Prosperity Center helped me get my certificate and I didn't have to worry about working full-time to pay for it. They provided me with the financial support to be able to afford my career," Carlin said.

VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance)

VITA assists those who make under \$55,000 receive 100% free tax preparation support by local volunteers. These families get their maximum refund and save money in fees so they can save more of their hard-earned money.

VITA takes places from January to April. Appointments are made by calling 211.

In 2019...

VITA volunteers contributed 1,061 skilled volunteer hours.

633 households connected to tax credits.

VITA saved clients over \$180,000 in tax preparation fees.

Brought back \$1.1 million in refunds.

\$541,877 in Earned Income Tax Credits.
