VITA Returns Over \$1.1 Million to ALICE Families

This spring, the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program offered FREE tax return preparation for qualified individuals who had income less than \$64,000 in 2023. Each year, we remain committed to helping our ALICE neighbors with low and moderate incomes receive the refunds and tax credits they deserve.

The VITA program has operated for over 50 years! United Way of Frederick County's Prosperity Center is Frederick County's largest VITA site. We are committed to providing 100% FREE tax preparation support so ALICE households can get back their maximum refund and save more of their hard-earned money. VITA is a critical stop along the Pathway to Financial Stability!

During the 2023 tax season, we successfully completed around 673 tax returns for the Frederick community, resulting in a total of \$1,127,994 in refunds. This marks an increase from last year, when we completed 612 tax returns, also resulting in a total of approximately \$1.1 million in refunds. With federal tax credits reverting to pre-pandemic levels and stimulus payments gone, a family of four is eligible for nearly \$15,000 less than the last few years. This challenge for ALICE families is highlighted in the 2023 tax season numbers with the increase in returns year-to-year, but stagnant refund total.

In addition to the money returned through tax refunds, many VITA clients indicated that they would have paid a tax preparer to complete their taxes if VITA was not available. **Thanks to the VITA program, these ALICE households were able to save an average of \$306 on this expense, receiving their tax refunds at no cost.**

The VITA program's assistance goes beyond just preparing tax returns. It significantly alleviates the financial burden on ALICE households, enabling them to save the money they would otherwise spend on tax preparation services. This program ensures that these households can receive their full tax refunds without incurring additional costs, helping them to better manage their finances and improve their economic stability.

This program would not be possible without the incredible work of our 12 dedicated volunteers!
